#### New Issues for Farmers

- Business distraction
- Changes in cultural practices
- Additional labor
- Production disruption
- Installation of mechanical controls
- Financial burden

#### **Business Distraction**

- Farming is a challenge in its own right
  - Labor management
  - Planting, production, and harvesting
  - Marketing
  - Pest and disease control
  - Rising cost of doing business
  - Regulatory obligations
- None can be put aside while dealing with eye gnats
- Management's attention will be diverted from the core business of farming

### **Cultural Practices**

- Techniques developed over years of research and trial and error may have to be changed
- Production techniques are often specific to that farm alone, so not simply changed
- Designed for peak efficiency and maximum production on that site
- Eye gnat control can disrupt a successful process developed through significant investment of time and resources

# **Cultural Practice Examples**

- Change in cultural techniques
  - Planting style
  - Use of organics to be added to the soil
  - Irrigation practices
- Additional tractor passes through the field
  - Cutting, drying, and tilling of organics
  - Can't move all soil in a single pass to create planting mounds

## **Production Disruption**

- Fallowing
  - Skip or delay planting cycle
  - Could miss good growing season
- Land lost to trap crops
- Time lost between crop rotations
  - Waiting for drying
  - Additional time to work field
- Possible crop change
- Possible loss of organic certification

## Installing Mechanical Controls

- Traps
  - Not available off-the-shelf
  - Require regular maintenance
  - Purchase of new equipment to service traps
- Flight barriers
  - Need substantial support
  - Subject to wind damage
- Trap crop
  - New crop to take care of
  - Have to spray with conventional pesticides

#### Financial Burden

- Increased labor costs
- Decrease in production
- Cost of mechanical controls
- Lost opportunities
- Fuel and equipment costs
- Increased expense/decreased income
