Placer RCD Overview

- Non-regulatory State special district with a Board of local landowners
- Mission: conserve agriculture and natural resources in Placer County
- Established with Federal (USDA) and State (Dept. of Conservation) partners
- Coordinate with resources to strategically meet the ag and natural resource needs in the area



Placer RCD Assistance

- Target: rural landowners who are not commercial ag producers (\$1000 gross sales/ year)
- Landowner Technical Assistance: irrigation efficiency, erosion control, wildlife habitat, fuels reduction, watershed health
- Workshops
- Chipper Program



NRCS - Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)

- Cost-share funding (50%) available for practices that improve natural resources – examples:
 - Irrigation efficiency
 - Erosion control cover crops, engineering
 - Wildlife habitat enhancement
 - Grazing management plan
- 2014 Farm Bill just passed apply anytime
- Beginning farmers qualify for higher cost-share rate
