#1 4-H Projects Completed

Purpose: This Category records projects a 4-H member has completed.

#2 4-H Project Skill Activities

Purpose: This category records activities where 4-H members exhibited their 4-H project work or demonstrated their knowledge to an audience and/or judge.

#7 Honors and Recognition

Purpose: This category records the significant honors and recognition earned by the 4-H member. The Intent of this category is to help members list what is significant to **THEM!**

- Fair honors- best of show, grand champion, best of class, placement in pen of three #7.
 Market and Showmanship Placements, Ribbon Placements & Special Awards.
 - Seal on County, Sectional, and State Presentation Day #7
- County Winner at SBC Fashion Revue #7
- State Winner at State Fashion Revue #7
 - Seal on poster contest poster #7
 - You can also mention ribbon awards in your story and your project reports.
- Placement on Record Book- club and county #7 (one credit for each competition)
- Placement on officer book #7
- Proficiency Earned #7 (one credit per proficiency/project level)

#8 Lifestyle Activities (4-H and outside 4-H)
Purpose: This category records lifestyle activities
both in and outside of 4-H that the member
participates in. Each Organization, group, activity
or sport counts as one credit per 25 hours.
Member must be an Active Participant for 25 or
more hours per quarter. It may be listed up to 4
