
Silent Auction Item:

4-H RECORD BOOKS

About 4-H Record Books

The 4-H program has a long history of record keeping. The focus reflects the important of this life skill in our daily lives. Completing a 4-H Record Book is a process where you record project and club work using a standard format.

Why have 4-H Record Books?

Completing the Personal Development Record in the Record Book provides you an incentive for participation, learning, and achievement.

Benefits of completing a 4-H Record Book:

Practice Record Management — Track your activities, events, profits and losses, skill development and learning experiences. In this competency skill you identify, create, classify, archive and preserve records.

- Reflect on your yearly work—Document your skill development and learning experiences in a written report.
- Measure your achievements and growth throughout your years
- Set goals, pursue strategies to meet those goals, and record how you may have had to shift gears in the face of challenges and obstacles.



Record Book Manual

Record Book Manual (PDF) - This manual was designed to be more kid-friendly than previous versions. It outlines all the parts of the Record Book and includes instructions for completing each form.

Record Book Forms

Record Book Forms (doc)

Contains all forms for 4-H members using a paper Record Book. This version allows you to complete the form directly into the document and expand the rows as needed. The ORB entry screens align with the paper version.

Individual forms

Personal Development Report—For Junior, Intermediate, and Senior members.

Annual Project Report—For Junior, Intermediate, and Senior members.

Leadership Development Report— For Intermediate and Senior members only.

Resume Template—For Senior Members only.



Book? In the Personal Development Record (PDR) Categories, 3. Events Attended.

- Record 4-H Events that you attend during the year. County any 4-H event that you attend outside of regular club and project meetings.
 - **Examples**
 - California Focus
 - Club Holiday Dinner
 - Achievement Night
 - **Fundraisers**
 - Field Days
- Fashion Revue
- Officers Training
- Leadership Conferences
- **Equine Play Day**
- **Livestock Clinics**

If you attend 4-H Craft Day where do you record that in your Record You may receive credit for attending the event as well as completing an activity that fits in another category.

Example — Attending County 4-H Presentation Day is counted in category 3 (Events Attended) and presenting a demonstration is counted in category 6 (Communication Skills)

A Note about Fairs:

If the fair you attend has a 4-H/FFA class, you can enter it as a 4-H Event Attended, even if the fair is not operated by 4-H. Shows and contests that are neither operated by 4-H nor consisting of 4-H showing divisions/classes are NOT considered 4-H events. If the show or contest relates to a 4-H project skill, it may be included in category 2 as a "Project Skill Activity Outside 4-H."
