Remember, in order to **SELL AND/OR EXHIBIT** at the Glenn County Fair (ABA Projects and Livestock), the front side of the Fair Participation Report Form needs to be filled out at the beginning of the year and signed by the member and parent. The back page is to be completed and turned in to the **UCCE Office by Monday, April 15, 2019.** At that time, the form needs to be initialed by the member, and signed by the project leader and the key leader, when necessary. You will not be able to exhibit at the fair if this form is not completed (including all signatures).

ALL GLENN COUNTY 4-H FAIR REQUIREMENTS MUST BE MET PRIOR TO THE FAIR ENTRY AND FAIR PARTICIPATION REPORT FORM DEADLINE.

If you are participating in livestock and stills, you will need to submit two different sets of the three forms, located in the Livestock and Stills Exhibitors Guide Books. The Exhibitors Guide Books, entry worksheets, and

PROJECT MEETINGS AT THE FAIRGROUNDS

This is for 4-H meetings only, not for personal use. The procedure on reserving the fairgrounds is to submit the Facility Use Request Form or call the UC Cooperative Extension Office and give them the dates that you would like to use it. This must be done at <u>least two weeks prior</u> to the meeting. Do not contact the fair directly. After the dates are cleared with the fairgrounds, the 4-H staff will get back to you to let you know if the dates that you requested are available. The County Director must approve all Facility Use agreements for insurance to be in effect. 

- May 13th Wednesday 15th Animals arrive for inspection and weigh in. Please check your livestock schedule in the exhibitor's handbook for your species. Please bring the Medical Declaration Form with you to weigh in. These forms can be found in the back of the exhibitor's handbook.
- May 14th Exhibitor/Leader Meeting, strongly encourage all to attend, Livestock Supervisors will cover questions and expectations that may come up during your week here. Queen Stage @ 6:30pm

Any premiums won and are under \$100 will be paid out in cash 24 hours after the fair recycles the judging sheets. You may pick up your money in the fair office anytime between 12:00pm and 2:00pm during fair week and in the fair office within 14 business days of fairs close. Any single premium over \$100 will be mailed within 14 business days of fairs close. Please see premium payout rule in the Exhibitors Handbook.
