



FAIR OFFICE REMINDERS

The fair office would like to remind everyone that when you enter your address in the Blue Ribbon Program, to please enter your mailing address. If the fair needs to mail anything to you, and you put in Your street address instead of mailing address, it will get returned back to the office and cause a delay for you. Please take the time to double check that your address is correct!

With the Colusa County Fair coming up, it's important to remember to be professional and polite when interacting with people at the Fair. We want to provide good information, follow all of the rules, and be great examples.

When people ask questions that we don't know the answer to:

Do not make up an answer! Giving out false information does not set a good precedence. Instead:

Good: "I actually don't know the answer, but I can look it up if you want, and get back to you with what I find. If you would like me to get back to you, may I please have your email?"

Bad: "I don't know. Look it up yourself."

When talking to people:

We're all really busy at the fair, but we have an opportunity to share agriculture and our knowledge with a variety of people who may not have experienced it before. Taking a few minutes of your time to explain what you're doing can be very beneficial, but if you're busy you could answer:

Good: "I need to finish getting ready for the show right now, but I can talk to you about what I'm doing as I do it, if you would like to listen, or we can talk more once I'm finished."

Bad: "I don't have time."

Biosecurity:

Set the example! If the public sees you doing it, they'll do it too. It might not seem important to you, but by being around animals, competitors and officials have built up immunities, which the public does not have.

Good: Don't eat around pens. Use hand-washing stations. Keep aisles and pens clean.

Bad: Throwing manure. Touching all the animals. Feeding the animals through fences with non-standard food.

HELP OUT ON ONE OF OUR COMMITTEES!

The Colusa County 4-H Council has designed committees open to any and all **youth and adults** who participate in the 4-H Program. The goal of the committees is to provide leadership by developing and implementing new ideas and events. All the committees work in partnership with the 4-H Council and 4-H Youth Development staff, the bulk of the decision making, planning and implementation lies in the hands of the committee. This structure allows for input from both adults and members in crafting the programs and managements strategies to best serve the needs of the 4-H community. Family & Consumer Science – Helps with Craft Expo, Home Ec Review/Cooking Craze, Fashion Review and the Colusa County Fair Still Exhibits. The committee plans where events will be held and makes changes to information given to members and evaluators at the event. After each event the committee meets to review evaluations to see if changes need to be made, and help incorporate new ideas.

Leadership – Helps with County Presentation Day, County Ambassador Program, Scholarships for Higher Education, Record Book judging, and Community Service Learning Projects. The committee helps design applications, plan out various events and helps provide feedback and input about the events.

Animal Science – Helps with Small Animal Field Days, Colusa County Fair Livestock Barn Duties, Horse/Dog Shows, and other animal related events. Members help with the planning of events and help develop new ideas for future events.

SHOOTING SPORTS WORKSHOP

Home Ec Award Tour Rules and Notes

Rules:

1. Each member must keep their own record of event participation.
2. A separate "Awards Record" form must be completed for each project to be considered. You may apply for an award in more than one project as long as you have enrolled in that project through the 4-H Office.
3. Each application must be signed and verified by the appropriate project leader before submitting it.
4. The projects included in Home Economics and Arts are:

Creative Arts & Crafts	Cake Decorating Clothing
Ceramics	Foods Preservation
Foods & Nutrition	Leathercraft
Home Furnishings	Needlecraft
Mini Gardens	Floral Display
Horticulture	Beginning 4-H
Plant Science	LEGO
5. Regular 4-H members who enroll in the above projects and participate in county 4-H events where points may be earned are eligible. Regular members must be 9 years old as of January 1st of the current 4-H year.
6. Points are earned for participation in county 4-H events, community service, and for exhibiting at the County Fair.

Notes:

When recording points: 10 points are awarded for participation in each county event (Home Ec Review Field Day Judging, Home Ec Review, Presentation Day, Etc.) Those 10 points are counted toward each project record, regardless of the number of projects per member. When recording points for county fair entries, only list those entries once under the correct project. Blue = 10, Red = 7, White = 3, Best of Show = additional 5 points.



Super Presenter

What is the Super Presenter Award?

The Super Presenter Award is a medal that is given to a 4-H member who has made five or more presentations during the club year.

Why Become a Super Presenter?

By working to be a Super Presenter, you can learn to speak before groups, share the skills and knowledge you have learned in 4-H with others, promote 4-H in your community, and show how 4-H has helped you.

How can I become a Super Presenter?

Requirements are:

1. Give a presentation at least five times during the club year. It does not have to be the same presentation each time.
2. You must give a presentation at a County Presentation Day.
3. Give a presentation at least once before a non-4-H group. (Service club, school, church, school classroom, senior citizen group, district, county, or state fair, etc.)
4. Complete and submit a Super Presenter application form to your Community Club Leader or Presentation Project Leader before June 24th of the current club year.
5. All application forms will be checked to insure that at least one of your presentations was given at a County Presentation Day.
6. Your application is turned into the 4-H Office by your Community Club Leader or Presentation Project Leader no later than July 1st of the year you wish to be recognized as Super Presenter.
7. Super Presenter will be announced at Achievement Night.

Super Presenter Application

(TO BE TURNED INTO THE 4-H OFFICE BEFORE JULY 1ST)

1. Return this application no later than June 24th of the club year to your Community Club leader or Presentation Project Leader.
2. Record the name of the group, place, and date of the presentation and obtain a signature of an adult representing the group.
3. Awards will be presented at Achievement Night.
