SPECIES	MANAGEMENT
All Birds and Plants	Study more sites
All Birds and Plants	You need a plan to achieve objectives
All Birds and Plants	Identify parties (landowner and lessee) and collaborate – takes time
All Birds and Plants	Inventory; determine what you want and the potential of the site; develop a plan
All Birds and Plants	Know what you can manage for; know conflicts
All Birds and Plants	Plan for the long-term; communicate impacts
All Birds and Plants	Collaboration between and among resource agencies
Clay Barrens	Continue historic management
All Birds and Plants	Include lessons based on anecdotes
All Birds and Plants	Study must be 7-10 years long to see weather effects
Lilies	Turn off water in troughs to reduce livestock traffic nearby
All Birds and Plants	Keep grazing; apply a variety of treatments across the landscape
All Birds and Plants	Manage for RDM
Burrowing owls	Graze heavily for good habitat
All Birds and Plants	Collaboration between ranchers and agencies
