

#### **Dead Sea Panoramic Complex**

The permanent exhibition of the Dead Sea Museum is located within the Dead Sea Panoramic Complex, and includes its geological, ecological, archeological, and historical origins, as well as the future conservation of the Dead Sea. The Dead Sea Museum introduces visitors to the physical and chemical characteristics, while highlighting the relationship between the Dead Sea and human beings in an attempt to promote the conservation and protection of the area. The full story of the Dead Sea is relayed with the use of panels, videos, and models to help clarify the conservation needs of the Dead Sea. Two documentary films, "Ecology of the Dead Sea" and "Dead Sea in Danger" are also on display in the museum. The education program encourages visitors to participate in several experiments which involve comparing Dead Sea water to fresh water and normal sea water.
