
Rosenberg International Forum on Water Policy

> "Resolving Conflict in the Management of Water Resources"

September 28 - 30, 1997 San Francisco, California Bank of America and the University of California have established a major new international forum on water policy, which will focus on reducing water-related conflicts while encouraging environmental protection and economic growth. It is called the Rosenberg International Forum on Water Policy in honor of retired Bank of America Chairman and CEO Richard M. Rosenberg, who has played a significant role in mediating water issues in California.

The Rosenberg Forum was established with an initial grant from Bank of America and will be permanently housed at the University of California's Water Resources Center. The Center, part of the University's Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources, is a systemwide University unit that supports research and information dissemination activities related to water resources. The Rosenberg Forum will sponsor a major international conference of invited scholars and policy makers every two years on water policy issues of global significance. The first conference is in San Francisco in September 1997, and at different international locations thereafter. A committee of academic and policy leaders, composed of seven individuals from five countries, guides the Forum and plans for conferences.

The theme of this year's conference is "Resolving Conflict in the Management of Water Resources." Following invited papers by leading experts on water, the environment, and economic growth, major policy makers will discuss the implications and potential for implementation of the findings presented by invited speakers. A proceedings of the Forum will be published by the University after the conference.
