

A few things to remember when completing your 4-H online enrollment:



- 1. All forms and fees must be turned in to your community club leader by **November 1st** and must be confirmed by your club leader by November 30th
- 2. Fees for the 2019-2020 4-H program year are \$100 for youth and \$30 for adult volunteers.
- 3. If you plan to show an animal at the 2020 Yuba Sutter Fair be sure to check the <u>Fair Eligibility Rules</u> for 4-Hers.

Volunteer assistance needed for fire science education

POSSIBLE CLUB PROJECT AND COMMUNITY SERVICE:

UC Cooperative Extension has an EPA Environmental Education grant to train teachers and teach students about fire science, our local ecology, and how to help prepare their families for wildfire. The curriculum is hands-on and our teacher kits need a few UNIQUE Pieces fabricated. While they will pay for all the materials, they lack the tools and expertise to fabricate some of the lab equipment. The fabricated materials help students understand fire behavior labs, and are the most popular lessons with teachers, and students alike.

 - Video about how the experiment works



IN MEMORIAM: Margery Magill



SHOOTING SPORTS UPDATES

- 1. 4-H Pistol Training October 12 -13: There will be a 4-H Shooting Sports leader certification training in pistol shooting offered October 12th and 13th,, 2019. This certification class will be held Saturday, 8 AM -4 PM, and Sunday, 8 AM-1pm, at the Safety First Shooting Association, River Oaks Range, 11584 Shaffer Rd, Winton, 95338, in Merced County. You must become a 4-H leader or member and attend both days to receive certification to teach Pistol marksmanship at the project, club and camp levels. The course will include a PowerPoint lecture, review of equipment, practice shooting and teaching, and a written test.
- 2. **4-H Archery|Rifle|Shotgun Shooting—November 9-10:** There will be a 4-H Shooting Sports leader certification training in either Archery, Shotgun or Rifle offered November 9 & 10, 2019. You may only get certified in one discipline during this weekend class. These class's will be held Saturday, 8 AM –4 PM, and Sunday, 8 AM-1pm, at the Safety First Shooting Association, River Oaks Range, 11584 Shaffer Rd, Winton, 95338, in Merced County. This class is being hosted by Merced County 4-H. You must become a 4-H leader or member and attend both days to receive certification to teach marksmanship at the project, club and camp levels. The course will include a PowerPoint lecture, review of equipment, practice shooting and teaching, and a written test.
- 3. **4-H Western Heritage December 14-15**: There will be a 4-H Western Heritage leader certification training offered December 14th and 15th,, 2019. This certification class will be held Saturday, 8 AM -4 PM, and Sunday, 8 AM- 4pm, at the Safety First Shooting Association, River Oaks Range, 11584 Shaffer Rd, Winton, 95338, in Merced County. This class is being hosted by Merced County 4-H. You must become a 4-H leader or member and attend both days to receive certification to teach the western Heritage project.
