Poultry - New Castle Update:

We have received an update on NewCastle disease.

The vND Quarantine is lifted!

"The United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) is announcing that effective June 1, 2020, we are transitioning our virulent Newcastle disease (vND) efforts in southern California from a response focus to implementing a prevention plan aimed at keeping vND from recurring in the region. Even with extensive testing taking place, APHIS has not confirmed any new vND cases since February 1, 2020. As a result, the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) is removing its vND quarantine."

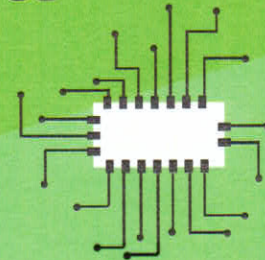

2020 MONTEREY COUNTY FAIR UPDATES!

We are still actively planning the 2020 Monterey County Fair! The entry guidebook is still under construction and our goal is to have it published on our website by June 1st. Online entries will open soon thereafter. Entry deadlines for most departments is August 7th.

The Monterey County Fair is monitoring the situation daily with County and State Health Officials, as well as following guidelines as set forth by the CDC. Of course, there is a real possibility that the Fair could be cancelled due to COVID-19. Should this happen, we are prepared to move forward with a full exhibits and livestock program including a junior livestock auction. We are hopeful that our exhibits and livestock program can be held in person with social distancing guidelines, however we are prepared for alternative platforms if needed.

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS – CHANGES TO 2020 RULES

Livestock

- No longer allowing overweight animals to sell

Show Weights

- Swine 210-280lbs
- Meat Goats 60-125lbs
- Market Beef 1000-1450lbs
- Sheep 105-160lbs

4-H & FFA Department

- No entry fees, no premium awards

Remember – this is the year to participate in the livestock show because you LOVE doing it, not to make a huge profit. We WILL have a junior livestock auction; however, this is not a year with typical average prices. 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2020 SAN BENITO COUNTY FAIR

JUNIOR MARKET STEER/HEIFER SHOW INFORMATION

On May 28, 2020 the Board of the 33rd committed to produce, at minimum, a virtual junior livestock market show and virtual auction.

Market Beef will be tagged on the regularly scheduled date, June 1, 2020.

Information adjustments, dates and times will be available in an alternate guidebook that will be forthcoming by June 30th including policy updates.

For the 2020 Fair experience, in any format, Exhibitors are limited to one (1) animal or meat pen to enter and sell under any circumstances, no exception. There will be no Breeding or Feeder Shows in 2020.

For Market Beef, June 1st is the ownership deadline AND July 31st is the entry deadline. A paper entry form will be available at tagging for beef on June 1st. Paper Entry form for all animals will be due to the SBC Fair Office with payment July 31st by 4:00pm or USPS postmarked (no metered mail). We will update more details on this process but, July 31st is the established entry deadline for all Market Livestock at the 2020 San Benito County Fair. This is a firm deadline and according to State Rules no late entries will be allowed.

We will communicate the virtual show and virtual auction details and process as soon as we engage a company and know the requirements. I anticipate that to by June 12th. All market animals entered in the virtual auction must enter the virtual show, no exception.

Please know that we are all working with many variables and unknowns and learning new things daily. Also, the COVID-19 pandemic has significantly impacted the economic status of the 33rd District Agricultural Association. Sponsorships and volunteer efforts will be critical if the 2020 San Benito County Fair is going to be a success in any form. We appreciate your continued patience as we all work to balance our challenging financial situation with our commitment to our exhibitors and their opportunity to learn about production agriculture.

NEW for 2020: Any market beef exhibitor wishing to purchase and pick up the hide of their auction animal must include the amount of \$150 included in their Fair entry by the entry deadline date of July 31st, 2020.

MINIMUM WEIGHT FOR MARKET BEEF IS 1,000 POUNDS. ANIMALS WEIGHING OVER 1300 POUNDS WILL ONLY BE PAID TO 1300 POUNDS

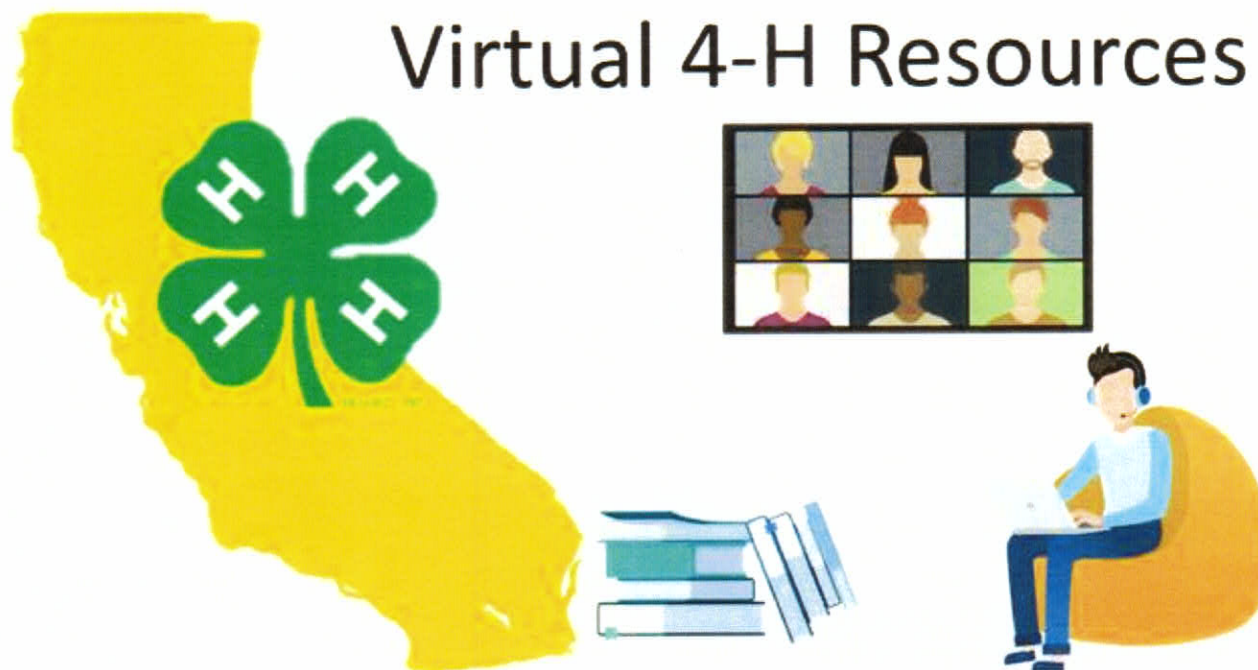
