Videos for the classes:

- Membership Cost is \$200 a year (not charged
- Go through the videos to find classes and try to find classes that seem easy but difficult enough (classes found on this site are not easy classes, most are from National Competitions)
- Make sure the videos are recent so that trends are up to date. Try to not use the free videos from the site. Just in case kids used them to practice.
- Create Power Point or Google Slide presentation & add videos to slides to be played on Zoom.
- Site has the scoring for each class, the class cuts, the judges scoring cards and a set of reasons.
 We only used the version where all 4 animals were tiled together instead of doing 15 to 30 seconds of each animal and then all 4 tiled.
- Each video was only about 1 1/2 to 2 min long but we played them on repeat 3 or 4 times and then asked the kids if they wanted an extra repeat. We did not have any repeat requests. This made the competition go faster so we had time to go over each class and read the reasons to the members and also to share some fun facts on the 4 animals we chose.
- Our youth committee did not compete in this competition as they had to view the videos & reports prior to the event.

- Review the Score Card with participants and re-iterate the specific animal numbering multiple times throughout the presentation.
- One Adult to run Power Point due to the uncertainty of internet connection for the event.
- Upon completion of all 4 classes
 - o Announce that the Google Form will be closed.
- Assisting Adult will close out form.
- Results and Learning- As time allows
 - Replay each class
 - o Give the official placing
 - Explain the cuts
 - Read the reasons
 - Discuss key points to judging livestock (classes are worth 50 points, how the cuts are deducted, etc.)

Fantastic Field Day Livestock Judging Contest

Youth Member Scripts:

Brayden:

Hello, my name is Brayden McVay and a member of Chualar 4-H. We are hosting livestock judging today. When you come to the zoom, the score card will be linked for you. You will watch 4 videos, swine, sheep, goats, and steers. You will place them in the order you think they should be placed. After all judging cards have been submitted, we will give the official placings of the classes and if time permits our team will give reasons for each class. Our adult leaders will explain more when you come to our rotation. Thank you for joining us.

Haylee:

Hello welcome to livestock judging hosted by Chualar 4-H. My name is Haylee and I am going to explain to you how this rotation will work. First thing, can everyone access the score card?

This is very important...At the top of the form please make sure you put your full name, age, and club. (Wait a second for everyone to do this)

Also, grab a pen and paper so you can take notes on the animals as you watch the videos!

Bella:

You are going to watch 4 different videos, one for swine, sheep, goats and steers. In each video there are 4 animals that you will place in the order you think they should be placed. If you watch the videos and think they should be placed 3, 4, 1, 2 you will choose the option for that order. The videos will roll through 4 times. If after the 4th one if you would like to see it one more time please raise your hand. They are quick videos, so we want to make sure everyone has a fair chance to evaluate the animals.

We ask that you stay quiet and do not talk to your neighbors or have parent help as this is a contest. If you have a cell phone, please do not use it during the contest. We would like to make sure this is fair to everyone.

Ok is everyone ready?

Pigs can't sweat. Brayden after Pig Videos

"Sweating like a pig" is another misleading commonly used phrase since pigs can't sweat! Pigs don't have many sweat glands, so they roll around and sleep in mud and swim in water to keep cool. A bonus to rolling in mud: it helps keep a pig's skin from getting sunburned.

Sheep remember their friends. Haylee after Sheep Videos

Sheep can recognize up to 50 other sheep faces and remember them for two years. However, sheared sheep don't recognize each other and may fight for a few days to re-establish hierarchy. They can also recognize human faces.

Goats get depressed Bella after Goat Videos

Goats are herd animals and will become depressed if kept without any goat companions. So it is unhealthy for a goat if a family just owns one as a pet

Cows have BIG stomachs Brayden after Steer Videos

The main stomach of a cow, the rumen, holds up to 50 gallons of food that has been partially digested. To put that in perspective, a bathtub can usually hold 30-50 gallons of water. A cow will consume about 40 pounds of food in a day.

Pigs are smarter than your dog. Bella if we have time at the end

It's true! Pigs have the intelligence of a human toddler and are ranked as the fifth most intelligent animal in the world! In fact, pigs are more intelligent and trainable than any breed of dog. They learn their names in just two weeks and come when they're called. Pigs are even capable of playing video games better than some primates.

Sheep, like goats, have rectangular pupils Brayden if we have time at the end


Their rectangular pupils allow them to have a 270 to 320 degree field of vision. This means that they can see almost everything around them, except for what's directly behind them, without having to turn their heads. This is especially useful for sheep as they are a prey species and need to always be on watch for predators.

Goats are climbers Haylee if we have time at the end

Goats, being mountain animals, are very good at climbing; they have been known to climb to the tops of trees, or even dams!







FANTASTIC FIELD DAY LIVESTOCK JUDGING CONTEST

February 13, 2021 – Virtual Zoom Hosted by Chualar 4-H

The purpose of Livestock Judging is to give 4-H members the opportunity to exhibit their animal evaluation skills. This year, they will judge a class of market swine, market lambs, market goats and market beef.

Requirements

• The judging is open to all 4-H members ages 9-19. Members can choose to be scored to compete or just try for fun. Cloverbuds may participate and will not be scored.

Format

- The score card will be linked to the Zoom Meeting.
- Each member must have their own email address. (Can be a parent but cannot share email with another member)
- All members in each rotation will watch the same four 5-minute videos (1 market swine, 1 market lamb, 1 market goat & 1 market beef)
- All animals are marked with the number 1,2,3, or 4.
- Members are to place the animals from 1st through 4th and then mark the judging sheet next to the animal's order that represents the correct placing. (ie, if 1st place pig is #2, 2nd place pig is #3, 3rd place pig is #1, and 4th place pig is #4; this would be represented as 2-3-1-4 on your score card)

Scoring

- The individuals who compete and win the highest overall score will be mentioned during the award ceremony.
- Individual awards will be given within each age category as follows:

Gold seal 180 – 200 points Blue seal 160-179 points

Red seal 140-159 points

White 139 and below



Official Placing: 4 3 2 1 Cuts: 4-2-4

2020 Texas A&M Aggiefest Class #5, Market Swine

Judge Critique

Big picture things to do first in this class to us were to go ahead and cover your ends. To start, there is a really nice barrow in 4. That's a wide constructed, dense centered hog that turns the most shape and dimension down his topside, and driving profile, he's a tall fronted, level designed hog that is athletic and square in his build.

On the other end, the solid white barrow 1 should have been found just as easy on bottom. He's big bodied and loose structured, but here's the earliest maturing, heaviest conditioned hog that offers the least skeletal width, rib shape, and muscle expression and dimension from blade to hip. Furthermore, he is also the frailest featured, lowest fronted hog that's the steepest out of his hip and consequently the poorest balanced.

That leaves you with a middle pair of hogs with tradeoffs, where we favored the extra power of 3 over the added design of 2. The 3 barrow is the wider chested, bolder bodied hog that's bolder in his forearm and blade, and continues back with more mass and power over his loin edge and back out of his pinset. He is also the bigger footed, heavier structured barrow of the pair. Now the chromed up 2 does offer a more heads up, tall fronted look and is more attractive in his hip and hindleg drive, he also motors around the ring with more range of motion and added comfort, and additionally maintains a leanness advantage. However, he's the frailer featured barrow that is more closed up underneath when you view him driving at you, and consequently is flatter about his blade and body, and narrow out of his hip and stifle.

Officials for the class are 4321 with cuts of 4-2-4.

Official Placing: 4 2 3 1 Cuts: 5-3-2

2020 Texas A&M Aggiefest Class #3, Market Lambs

Judge Critique

On video, class 3 became the most challenging class in the sheep and goat division. With that said, finding 4 is not difficult. Muscular, compositionally correct, and still nice balanced. We agreed he won with a 5 point cut.

From there, challenges come because each sheep left has a problem or two and still some positives as well. We ended up sliding 2 in second. Outside of the fact that he pulls his hock in slightly from behind, he's easily the wider chested, bolder ribbed sheep of the three remaining who still combines shape with some leanness and cutability. We don't like his view from behind like I am certain many of you didn't, so we kept the cut small and only discounted you 3 if you didn't keep him in your top pair.

We found the final pair to be even closer, both sheep need more shape to their rib cages and view pretty general in terms of their leg shape, but we read 1 to be neater in his chest floor, more correct in his lines, and youthful in his look. 3's advantage was a stouter hip, but he was just as shallow twisted and flat in his stifle. With that, the deepest chested sheep read the most mature in his look and did not proportion as well from chest to flank. We cut that pair 2.

Official for class 3 market lambs was 4213 with cuts of 5-3-2.

Official Placing: 1 2 3 4 Cuts: 5-4-2

2020 Texas A&M Aggiefest Class #1, Market Goats

Judge Critique

This class ended up being high quality and very sortable in our opinion. The breakdown ended up becoming what we consider to be an easy top, default second, and a very close bottom pair.

The undeniable place to start is with the cape fronted 1 goat. For starters, he is easily the widest built, roundest ribbed goat who spreads the most shape over his top and comes the stoutest to his hip and lower leg. Plus, in terms of balance, his chest, shoulder and neck set blended with his strong top and tucked up body cavity give him the most youthful yet high quality look. If you do not find him, you get cut 5.

Next in line, 2 easily falls into second from a carcass perspective and we cut the middle 4. Of the remaining three, he's easily the widest chested, bigger forearmed goat who portrays more thickness from the rear view. My opinion that he is easily a top pair goat is further confirmed when the camera gets a shot down his top where he is so much wider and squarer in his shape. Step to this side, he is just a little deeper chested, weaker topped and steeper hipped; that is why he got beat.

The decision for us came on bottom, where both goats give off a lower quality look and still do not have enough muscle. We simply felt 3 had a retained advantage in skeletal width up front and shape from above. No doubt, 4 reads better in the angles of his front structure and the set to his hock. For us though, it makes sense to keep the flat, narrow chested goat who is the lightest muscled in a close 4th and cut it 2.

Official for class 1 market goats was 1234 with cuts of 5-4-2.

Bellville Collegiate Workout Class #5, Market Steers

Judge Critique

I like the Market Steers 1324 with cuts of 6-2-4

To save points there's two must dos in this class. 1 is an absolute man in this group. His muscularity in tandem with his extra look and fat steer proportions set on such a comfortable set of lower joints is impressive and unmatched in this class. An awfully nice black slick calf has to start.

On the opposite end of the spectrum 4 falls out from just a sheer build and balance perspective. He's without question a mellow easy feeding calf that is not devoid of muscle. Just too course and spend about his shoulder. The stale hided steer that is too straight and insecure in his hock and pastern rolls up in his top as he goes.

Its competitive in middle. Just read the longer necked unheeded 3 to be a touch neater looking and more shapely up high. I like that 2 counters him in terms of being more practical through his mid rib and softer back in through his rear rib and flank. The plainer fronted frailer option is just too snug in his fore rib and rounder out of his hip.
