## Girls Health Countywide Project

Periods. We're talking about periods! Join us as we explore a girl's monthly cycle from a new perspective.

While often shrouded in a cloud of mystery & even shame, we'll be going "behind the scenes" to look at this 5th vital sign. Yup, vital sign! Back in 2015 the ACOG (American College of Obstetricians & Gynecologists) decreed that a girl's cycle is her 5th vital sign & indicator of health.

In this project we'll be exploring the different phases of a cycle & how each plays into a girl's everyday health - in the way she feels, eats, moves, & thinks. These incredible hormones really do impact so many aspects of our lives!


This program is not geared towards sex education but only body literacy as it pertains to female hormones & this 5th vital sign. There's a lot of taboo around this topic & it can be uncomfortable for some. But we're going to take that head on & address it with sensitivity together because this information is pertinent for healthy living.

We'll have 5 meetings that will include both experiential learning & some time in the kitchen preparing foods that support each cycle phase. (There will be a small fee to cover the supplies for the cooking portion.)

There is no age requirement for this class because the information is pertinent to girls whether or not they have started cycling. Parents are always welcome to attend & participate in our meetings - though please check with your daughter for her permission as well.

## 4-H Alumni Study - Early Adult Outcomes

A California 4-H alumni study data collection is taking place August 19 to September 24, 2021. It is to explore how 4-H experiences shaped early adult outcomes. The survey assesses long-term outcomes (economic stability, health and well-being, and community involvement) as hypothesized in the literature (Gambone et al., 2002; Dogan et al., 2012; Arnold, 2018).

All 4-H alumni are invited to respond to the survey; however, for this study, the following criteria apply (1) enrolled as a California 4-H youth member between 2008 and 2017, (2) enrolled as a 4-H youth member for at least three (3) years, and (4) are now between the ages of 20 and 35. The California 4-H Statewide Equine Program exists to provide high-quality equine events where 4-H members have opportunities to apply their growing knowledge and skills of horses in a fun, safe, and supportive environment.

Meeting this goal involves a team of youth and adult volunteers who have a passion for working with horses, youth, and continuing to grow the 4-H equine program. This team of people works alongside of CA 4-H Program Staff to make statewide equine events happen, make them fun, and make them meaningful.

Applications are currently being accepted through August 31, 2021 for two types of equine volunteer positions:

1. Equine Statewide Planning Team
2. Equine Event Teams

### ATTENTION HORSE PROJECT MEMBERS – Devils Garden Colt Challenge 2021

California 4-H and FFA youth have the opportunity to take home and train a Devil's Garden Wild Horse weanling. The weanlings are 4-6 months at pick up. Youth trainers are given a 6 month training period with additionally check in challenges, and then culminates in a live horse show where participants can show their horse's progress through various show classes. Although the program is called the “colt” challenge, mares and geldings are available. Application process opens September 1<sup>st</sup> and closes October 1<sup>st</sup>.

There is a wide variety of prizes available to win from cash, grooming supplies, horse feed, buckles, ribbons and more! The 2021 Colt Challenge had over \$3,000 in cash and prizes to award. After the lottery, youth are given a time period to pick up their horses. After pick-up, youth are contacted to check on progress and if everything is going well, youth will receive title in the mail for their horse.



# COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

UPDATED 08/10/2021

## ***Basic Safety Standards for Meeting In-person***

*These safety standards must be followed for all in-person 4-H activities.*

Do not participate in any in-person 4-H activities if you are sick or have COVID-19 symptoms or if you or someone you have been in contact with has been diagnosed with COVID-19.

## **Symptoms Include**

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

## **Face Mask Use**

Outdoor activities with youth and adults:

No face masks required.

Indoor Activities with youth and adults:

Everyone must wear a facemask.

## **Indoor Physical Distancing**

All wearing a mask and maintaining a minimum of 3 feet between participants is required for indoor activities.

Maintain 6 feet of distancing during times when members and volunteers are not masked due to eating or drinking.

## **Maintain Hygiene Practices**

After each use, clean and disinfect workspaces and equipment, wash hands often, and/or use hand sanitizer.
