Following recent fires in our communities, partner agencies supported the development of a systemic program to provide options for commercial livestock operators to access restricted areas following a natural disaster in order to provide care for livestock.

To that end multiple agencies have established a program known as the Livestock Access Pass which may permit commercial livestock operators to gain entrance to evacuation zones, or other restricted areas, to provide feed, water, medical treatment, and other care to large-scale commercial livestock. Program includes pass overview and basic fire training by CalFire.

The registration and training for the pass is being managed by Josh Davy, Tehama County Livestock and Natural Resources Advisor, UC Cooperative Extension.

The passes will be administered and approved through the Tehama/Glenn/Colusa County Ag Commissioner's Office
