No In-person 4-H Activities Until February 15th, 2022

As of January 19, 2022, all 4-H in-person activities can only be held OUTDOORS with 6 feet distancing, or virtually.

We have been receiving multiple reports of exposures from 4–H activities. Because of the current high transmission of omicron, ANR Risk & Safety determined that for now we must limit indoor interactions to limit exposures for our youth and families. We can continue 4–H activities outdoors while practicing social distancing, or shift to virtual options.

As always, our focus is on the health and safety of our youth, volunteers and families. We do not want 4-H activities to be the cause of a youth to not be able to go to school, or an adult volunteer to not be able to go to work. While we are all disappointed in this change, we know that we can overcome this disappointment and pivot, as we have in the past. Thank you to all our youth, volunteers and staff. Swags for Veterans

On December 12 2021, the Potter Valley 4–H Club honored veterans by making holiday swags and placing them on their graves.

4–H members and volunteers arrived at the rodeo grounds at noon and made more than 170 swags out of fir, cedar, holly berries, pyracantha berries, toyon, wire, and ribbon. Members of the Potter Valley 4–H Club started making their own swags in 2020 as part of their community service efforts.

At three o'clock the evergreen swags were taken to the Potter Valley Cemetery for a special ceremony held at the flagpole. Joleen Logan talked about a letter received regarding an unknown veteran of World War II, William Wadsworth Williams, with a request to honor the veterans of Potter Valley that are not buried in the cemetery. Hannah Seever then placed a memorial wreath in remembrance of all Potter Valley Veterans.

Lovina Penry spoke about the meaning of the event, saying, "Today we show a united front of national unity all across the United States of America as we remember the fallen, honor those who serve, and teach our children the value of freedom by the laying of wreaths at this Christmas season."

Luke Logan led the Laying of the Wreaths, and the Gamble, Scatena, Logan, Whitley, Powis, and Penry families placed a wreath honoring each branch of the military.

After the ceremony, 4–H members and volunteers decorated veterans' tombstones with swags and American flags.
