**Agenda Review & Accept** Motion made by Marci Sanchez to accept the agenda; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Anne Bonesio. Unanimously approved by attendees.

**Minutes of previous meeting to be approved as handed out, read and/or corrected** – Corrections requested to include were discussed by meeting participants. Motion to approve January minutes with stated corrections by Anne Bonesio; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mark Kampmann. Unanimously approved by attendees. Corrections to be included: Loren Chapman, President stated to cancel the Livestock challenge if a Chairman for the event did not volunteer. Mark Kampmann stated he talked on behalf of the JLA meeting, updating that clean-up was happening, and old shavings were coming out.

**Financial Report-** Treasurer-Marci Sanchez-Lea Eddy reviewed financials with her. Nothing to report at this time but there will be next meeting due to 4-H dinner ticket sales. Budget was not available to share with those on Zoom.

### **Officer Reports**

President, Loren Chapman-Nothing to report

Vice President of Livestock, Corie Hurlburt-Pens have been pulled out. There is a meeting tomorrow night, March 1<sup>st</sup>. Mark Kampmann states Mike Karle talked about prop-12 certification and that it will not affect pigs this year. Mark Kampmann also stated each club needs to figure out their own water. No water will be offered. Water spickets will be available but will be shared. Suggested using gravity fed waterers. This is for pigs and sheep only. All pens are out. New pens have arrived. It was also mentioned that no pulling in and parking on delivery day will be allowed. Security will be enforcing this.

**Correspondence-** Holly Pool, Secretary-Thank you card for donations from 43<sup>rd</sup> Annual Glenn Co. Farm Bureau was shared.

### **Unfinished Business**

- Roasting Pan Storage Totes- Christine Kampmann states the Farm Bureau donated a roaster so 4-H now has five roasters. Marci Sanchez made a motion to purchase five roasting pan storage totes as presented for \$174.45; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Anne Bonesio. Marci Sanchez clarified to take funds out of the reserves.
- Pop-up Tent Logo- Discussed the previous plan for the pop-up tents was to have Oscars put the logo on them for \$50/tent, six tents total. However, due to the type of fabric Oscars is unable to vinyl or paint logo. Quote from "All In Vinyl" was received. They can do a banner that will be the same length and width as pop-up's. The banner will fit the banner loops on the pop-up and on the lip of the awning for \$325. UCNR has a policy that only approved vendors may be used so this company is willing to complete paperwork to become an approved vendor. Anne Bonesio made a motion to purchase pop up tent banners as presented once approved vendor paperwork received, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Marci Sanchez. Unanimously approved by attendees.
- Glenn County 4-H Committee Sign-ups- Chair, Marci Sanchez stated she sent out an email to Key Leaders to promote more participation on committees and to take it to the clubs and project leaders. If there are any questions reach out to Marci Sanchez or Christine Kampmann. The hope is to expand and get new people involved and new ideas.

### **New Business**

**Friends of the Fair Dinner** (Saturday, March 26, 2022, social hour is 6:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m., dinner to follow)-Discussed the needs for the Friends of the Fair Dinner for Adults and all members. Job responsibilities include: clearing tables (excluding alcoholic beverages/ containers), serving ice cream cups to tables after main course, running raffle prizes (older members) and cleaning up after the event. This event needs 25-30 children, and 1-2 adults will be needed to assist with clearing alcohol from the tables. The adult/child ratio needs to be 1/4. Unrefrigerated desserts are needed: cupcakes, cakes, cookies, pies. Attire will be their 4-H hat, tie/scarf, white top, and jeans. Mask must be worn by adults and youth and will be supplied by the UCCE office. Gift Basket Donation from each club is also needed. Kathy Baldrige mentioned they would like sixth grade and up and that a Heritage Foundation donation came to each club prior. A Chairman is needed for this event and needs to RSVP to the office by March 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Livestock Challenge Event Committee Update-** Corie Hurlburt states she signed up to Chair event and selected a date however that day did not work for the office staff. Office staff informed Corie they had interviews that week. Corie is unable any other weekends the month of April, so the Livestock Challenge is again cancelled.

**4-H Fundraiser Dinner Event Committee Update** - Willows 4-H Club Chair: Abby Alves, Loren Chapman Corie Hurlburt, Debbie Scritchfield, Jaime Hobbs, and Holly Pool. Loren reports the meat was picked up and was able to purchase it for \$1.98/lb. More bakers are needed. Sign-up genius will be resent. Sav Mor is setting aside some desserts. Holly Pool mentioned there is an issue securing rolls. Christine Kampmann states she will give an update on rolls later.

**ABA Extravaganza Event Committee Update**, Schaffert 4-H Club Chair, Marci Sanchez- Meeting next week with Christine. The outside area added to contract. Marci has someone inline to run interview section and a panel in place. There are some returning judges already lined up.

- 4-H Policy Update
  - Meeting/Gathering Policy- Updates on 2.16.22
    - Able to resume indoor activities.
    - Masks must be worn indoors when youth are present for all persons, regardless of vaccination status for indoor gatherings.
    - For meetings with groups of 4-H adult volunteers (no youth present), those who are fully vaccinated are not required to wear masks.
    - Masks are not required for outdoors social distancing. Maintain social distancing of three feet.

- Missing Key Leader Forms Needed- Past Due Monday, December 6, 2021. A reminder will be sent out next week.
