Concours d'Elegance is an antique and classic car show held at Ironstone Winery in Murphys. 4-H members and families volunteer to help with the event and in return, the Ironstone Concours Foundation helps support our program.

We need members of all ages!

- to give presentations,
- bring project displays,
- bake homemade cookies, wrapped in quantities of 4 to 6,
- and work in the different venues at the event.

Presentations can be done individually or as teams and begin at 11:00. The impromptu speaking contest begins at 12:30. Displays are set up no later than 9:30. Members stay with their displays to talk to the general public about 4-H. Presentations and displays can be about any 4-H project or activity. Small live animals are always an attraction.

Each county is responsible for supplying at least 20 dozen home-baked (not store bought) cookies, packaged 4-6 in sandwich size bags, for the award bags given to the car show winners. Baggies of cookies can be decorated with green ribbon and dropped off at the 4-H office or brought to the Concours event by 8:45 a.m. and dropped off in the Heritage Room kitchen at Ironstone Winery.

Concours d'Elegance cont'd:

4-H members and adults are needed to take tickets, hand out programs, assemble the award bags, and assist in the merchandise booth. Ambassador and Leadership Team members help at the Gala Lunch and Awards Ceremony. Admission and lunch are free for 4-H members volunteering, presenting, and for one supervising 4-H adult per family.

The Concours features race cars, steam and electric-powered vehicles, high-end hot rods and customs, plus American and European classics.



2022-2023 Tuolumne County Minimum Record Book Directions

To be eligible to show livestock at the 2023 Mother Lode Fair as a 4-H member, you must complete the following:

- 1. 80% Project Meeting Attendance
- 2. Complete a Full or Minimum Record Book

A minimum record book must be signed by your project leader and club leader then submitted for verification to your club leader in early June.

Directions for completing a Minimum Record Book:

- 1. Fill in the Personal Information.
- 2. Complete the APR, listing all activities you did with your project. Include time spent at home working with your animal, as well as project meetings and additional events you attended. Add additional lines as needed.
- 4. Write a 4-H Story. The 4-H Story is written describing the member's year in 4-H. Word number guideline is included below.
- 5. Include a picture of yourself with your fair entry whether it is market or breeding. Include information about the animal on the page with your picture.
- 6. Print out all documents and fasten securely in a report cover to submit to your club leader.

Note: Separate books are not required for additional projects. Add additional APRs only for each project entering at fair.

4-H Record Book year goes from 6/1/2022 to 5/31/2023. Only enter information happening between those dates.


