

All families are responsible for submitting youth enrollment fees to complete enrollment. Youth fees are \$65 for the 2022-2023 program year.

The payment options are:

- Bring exact cash to the UCCE Office during business hours, Monday Friday 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Bring exact cash or check to the UCCE Office and place in the drop box in front and to the west of the UCCE Office glass doors. Please notify the UCCE Office by calling at (530) 865-1107 or email glenncounty4h@ucanr.edu and to ensure we receive it.
- Pay by credit card via the website survey: https://surveys.ucanr.edu/survey.cfm? surveynumber= 31868. There is a \$2 service fee per youth enrolled.
- If you meet the qualifications, complete and turn into the UCCE Office a Request for a 4-H Program Fee Waiver/Reduction. The form can be found at: https://ucanr.edu/sites/glenn/files/370749.pdf.

Enrollment Deadline for Fair Exhibition was Monday, October 3, 2022.

PARTICIPATION IN 4-H ACROSS COUNTY AND CLUBS

The county of residence is the primary county for 4-H YDP enrollment. 4-H members may participate in projects offered by a neighboring club, county or state if the member's primary club does not offer the 4-H project a member is interested in. See the Project Across Club, County or State Lines Request and Agreement Form at: https://ucanr.edu/sites/UC4-H/files/4752.pdf.

A 4-H member may only be enrolled in one county as their primary county. Any exceptions to this residence requirement must have prior approval from 4-H YDP staff in both counties and/or states affected. Complete and submit a Request for 4-H Membership in a neighboring County or State annually at: https://ucanr.edu/sites/UC4-H/files/203025.pdf.

GLENN COUNTY 4-H ENROLLMENT PROCESS

ADULT VOLUNTEER INITIAL ENROLLMENT PROCESS

All new leaders must go through a screening process as safety of our youth is our number one priority. New leaders must complete the following:

- 1. Complete the 4-H Adult Volunteer Interest Survey online at: http://ceglenn.ucanr.edu/glenn_county_4-hprogram_286/join_4-h/become_aleader/.
- 2. Submit the 4-H adult volunteer application paper packet to the UCCE Office or complete the online enrollment at: https://v2.4honline.com/#?user/sign-in. The 4-H Enrollment will show as pending until all steps are complete.
- 3. Complete the 2022-2023 California New Volunteer Course found at: https://campus.extension.org/course/view.php?id=2225. The enrollment key is: Glenn. You will complete five modules. It will take approximately three hours. Once complete, please send a picture of your certificates to: glenncounty4h@ucanr.edu.
- 4. Complete your livescan (fingerprinting) clearance with the Sate Department of Justice. Be sure to complete and bring the Glenn County 4-H Request for Live Scan Service form and a photo ID to your appointment. This form can be found at: http://ucanr.edu/sites/glenn/files/322710.pdf. Glenn County Office of Education in Willows offers Livescan Fingerprinting appointments in our area. Please be sure to call to set up an appointment at (530) 934-6575. Council will reimburse up to \$20.00 for your livescan if you submit a receipt.
- 5. Once the enrollment process is completed it is reviewed and if approved, you will receive a notification of your 4-H adult volunteer appointment from 4-H Online and you will receive a letter and appointment card notifying you.

ADULT VOLUNTEER RE-APPOINTMENT PROCESS

4-H adult volunteers must apply and be appointed annually. Returning adult volunteers without a break in service must complete the following:

- Submit the 4-H adult volunteer application paper packet to the UCCE Office or complete the online enrollment at: https://v2.4honline.com/#?user/sign-in. The 4-H Enrollment will show as pending until all steps are complete.
- Complete the 2022-2023 4-H California Returning Volunteer Course found at: https://campus.extension.org/course/view.php?id=2224. The enrollment key is: Glenn. You will complete one module on Abuse Prevention for UC Volunteers which is approximately 15 minutes long. Once complete please send a picture of your certificate to glenncounty4h@ucanr.edu.
- 3. Once the enrollment process is completed it is reviewed and if approved, you will receive a notification of your 4-H adult volunteer appointment from 4-H Online and you will receive a letter and appointment card notifying you.

Failure to re-apply as a 4-H Adult Volunteer (Break in Service) State 4-H Policy

- 1. 4-H adult volunteers who do not annually reapply to continue as a 4-H adult volunteer are considered to have a break in service and may not serve as a 4-H adult volunteers until the necessary steps are taken.
- 4-H YDP staff must send a list of names and birthdates of all 4-H adult volunteers that do not reapply to the Custodian of Criminal Records at the UC ANR Office of Risk Services and State of California, Department of Justice (DOJ) by July 31 of each year.
- If the person applies to be a 4-H adult volunteer at some point in the future, they will need to repeat the volunteer application and enrollment process, including live-scan criminal records check.

Leaders will need to be enrolled this year by December 31, 2022 to avoid a break in service.

All Leaders must complete the enrollment process before holding project meetings.

GETTING STARTED

FINDING YOUR SPARK

What are Sparks?

Everybody has a skill, a talent, an interest, or a special quality that they are passionate about. We call these things SPARKS. They provide joy, purpose, and direction. Sparks are self-discovered and self-identified. They come from deep within and provide energy, joy, purpose, and direction in one's life.

4-H offers many opportunities for youth to explore and discover their sparks. Examples include:

- **Community clubs** offer a variety of projects that youth can enroll in. This allows for the exploration of a new interest and connection to other youth who are also interested in exploring that interest.
- **Teens as Teachers** experiences offer a chance for older youth to share their interests with younger children, in a teaching role.
- 4-H Special Interest (SPIN) clubs offer youth an opportunity to explore a new interest and connect with peers who have that same interest.
- **After-school programs** introduce youth to different potential interest areas in a shorter amount of time, with the freedom to branch off from structured activities and explore anyone for as long as they wish.

RECORD BOOK FORMS

Completing a 4-H Record Book is a process where you record projects and club work which will be beneficial later down the road. When you practice record management it allows you to track your activities, events, profits and losses, skill development and learning experiences. It also helps you reflect on your yearly work document what skills you learned. You can measure your achievements and growth throughout your years in 4-H set goals, pursue strategies to meet those goals, and record how you may have had to shift gears in the face of challenges and obstacles.

The 2021-23 Record Book Manual and Record Book Forms are now available. There are no changes from the 2021-22 edition to this two-year edition. All forms and manuals can be used for both program years. You can find the most up to date forms at: https://ceglenn.ucanr.edu/Glenn County 4-H Program 286/Forms 839/. It is strongly recommended that you work on your record book forms throughout the year as you attend events to better ensure accurate records and attention to more detail. It is so much easier to write the skills that you learn while it is still fresh in your head!

4-H POLICY UPDATE

When planning 4-H events and activities, the expectation is always that a **minimum of two approved 4-H Adult Volunteers will be present**.

Only in the event that an appointed 4-H Adult Volunteer has had an urgent matter, and it then becomes impractical or impossible for a minimum of two appointed adult volunteers to be present for the 4-H event or activity, would staff then coordinate and designate another adult at **least 21 years old** to participate.

FACILITY USE REQUESTS

For **club and project** meetings at public places and all business locations etc. it is important that you bring a completed Facility Use Request Form to the UCCE Office at least 14 days prior to your project meeting. Some circumstances may require additional time base on the contracts. Facility Use Request Forms can be found at: https://ucanr.edu/sites/glenn/files/307215.pdf. Volunteers may not sign contracts of any kind on behalf of UC, nor otherwise obligate the Regents of the University of California in any way. All agreements and/or contracts must be executed by an authorized UC employee. Some contracts may take up to 60 days for processing.

Providing a safe environment free from physical and psychological harm is paramount in achieving these desired outcomes. PROFICIENCIES AVAILABLE

The goal of the Glenn County 4-H Proficiency program is to give members recognition and rewards in a timely manner and in a variety of ways to meet the diverse needs of today's youth.

It is also designed to assist youth in measuring themselves against 'standards of excellence'. Each proficiency is comprised of three skill levels and should be designed to increase in scope and difficulty. The proficiencies' purpose is to:

- Provide youth opportunities to sample a broad array of experiences, measure personal progress, and become selfdirected learners.
- Provide a standard of excellence where members are recognized for knowledge and skills they have mastered.
- Provide guidelines for leaders to enhance and expand project content and experiences.

We encourage leaders to give proficiency guides to members sometime during the first or second year in a project. Proficiencies can be found at: https://ceglenn.ucanr.edu/Glenn County 4-H Program 286/Project Information/ Project Proficiency/. Once a member completes all the steps and gets the project leaders signatures, they will turn the completed form in to the UCCE Office. Recognitions will be given out at the Star Awards and Leaders' Appreciation Event.



To help make the 4-H experience fair for every member regardless of which club or county they participate in, the Steps to Success in 4-H has been developed.

This document outlines:




COUNTRY PUMPKINS CLUB HOST DAYS

LIVESTOCK FIELD DAY AND LIVESTOCK CHALLENGE

The Livestock Field Day and Livestock Challenge will be held on **Saturday, November 19, 2022** at the Glenn County Fairgrounds. Any 4-H member, in all age divisions, are welcome to participate in both events.

The **Livestock Challenge** is an opportunity for members to demonstrate their livestock knowledge. 
We are excited to welcome Nicole Marshall-Wheeler to Glenn County 4-H, as the new 4-H Youth Development Advisor (4-H Advisor)!






2022-2023 GLENN COUNTY 4-H FAIR EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS



4-H Youth Development Program

The 2022-2023 program year requirements to exhibit and participate at the Glenn County Fair are:

PRIMARY MEMBERS

- 1. Follow requirements and rules set by the Glenn County Fair.
- 2. You must be enrolled in 4-H no later than **Monday, October 3, 2022**.
- 3. **Project Completion** Must complete six hours of project instruction, or more, as required by the project leader in the project area by the fair entry deadline.

JUNIOR, INTERMEDIATE, AND SENIOR MEMBERS

- 1. Follow requirements and rules set by the Glenn County Fair.
- 2. Be a member in good standing. You must be enrolled in 4-H no later than Monday, October 3, 2022.
- 3. Project Completion
 - a. **ABA (Anything But Animals) Members** Must complete a minimum of six hours of 4-H project instruction or more as required by the project leader by the **fair entry deadline**.
 - b. **Livestock/Animal Project Members** Must complete a minimum of six hours of 4-H project instruction or more as required by the project leader before **the fair weigh-in date(s)**.
- 4. Complete and turn in the Annual Project Report (APR) form to your Club Key Leader, by the due date set the previous program year. (See Steps to Success in 4-H)
- 5. Give a presentation at County Presentation Day, a Club Meeting, a Project Meeting, a qualifying county event, service clubs, school classrooms, senior citizens groups, etc. (Presentations given to neighbors, relatives, or friends DO NOT count.) The subject of the presentation must be directly related to the project being exhibited at the Glenn County Fair.
 - a. If a member will be exhibiting an ABA project as well as a livestock animal, the member can choose a presentation for either project.
- 6. Livestock exhibitors must attend the Glenn County 4-H Livestock Challenge/Field Day Event. Alternative events are the CSU 4-H Livestock Evaluation, CSU Chico State Livestock Field Days, or a related livestock event from a neighboring county.
- 7. ABA exhibitors must attend Glenn County 4-H ABA Extravaganza Event. Alternative events are the Glenn County 4-H Quilt Show, Fashion Revue, or a related ABA event from a neighboring county.

The project leader has the right to refuse to sign the Glenn County Fair entries if the requirements have not been met by the member.
