
ATCAA COMMUNITY SERVICE FOOD DRIVE

The Drive Thru Dinner is a fundraiser for Tuolumne County 4-H Council for leadership conferences, 4-H fee waivers, 4-H events and more. All money received is a donation to 4-H Council. All 4-H members are encouraged to take the flyers to people and sell dinners. All 4-H families are invited to help put on the dinner. Dinner tickets will be open for purchase from November 1 to January 6th. Get your tickets early.

The complete dinner for \$50 includes a whole seasoned & barbecued Tri-tip, 1 quart of beans, a loaf of garlic bread and a bag of salad. Extra cooked tri-tips are \$30. The dinner and extra tri-tips are pre-order only. Get your orders in early; there will only be 350 dinner s available. Back by popular demand will be the small chocolate and lemon loaf cakes, \$6 for one or \$10 for two, available during the dinner while supplies last.

WHAT CAN YOU NOT PUT IN THE BOX?

No Candy; no toothpaste; no gum; no used or damaged items; no scary or war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; no chocolate or food, like seeds, fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; no drink mixes (powdered or liquid); no liquids or lotions; no medications or vitamins; no breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers
