4-H council updates:

The council approved the 4-H calendar. We discussed our county's vote to the 4-H state office for next year's enrollment fee changes across the state. Note: We were given a short window to cast a vote, so I was not able to send out an announcement prior to the 4-H council meeting. We are waiting for the results as this is s majority rule vote. Each county was given one vote with 42 counties voting as 12 counties are not participating. The 12 counties are funded solely by their county under the board of supervisor budgets. We are currently waiting for the results to be announced from the 4-H state office. The results will be announced at the next council meeting on February 27th.

Devii Rao also announced the new Community Educational Specials Advisor for our county, Santa Cruz, Monterey, San Luis Obispo, and Santa Barbara counties who was hired by the 4-H state office. Ana Torres will be working in an administrative role as my new supervisor. I will continue to work in my role as the 4-H program representative for San Benito and Santa Cruz counties.

We also have a new county director for San Benito, Santa Cruz, and Monterey that just started on February 1st, David Gonzales. Devii Rao will be stepping down as county director and continue as the Range Livestock Advisor for San Benito, Santa Cruz, and Monterey counties. Many changes are happening from the state office's upper management but I will do my best to provide an outstanding job to our 4-H families in our county.



Fantastic 4-H Poster Contest 2023

Posters due by Thursday, March 2nd

The Poster Contest is open to enrolled 4-H members, ages 9-19. Poster must have been created in the 2022-2023 program year. Age categories: Junior members (ages 9-10), Intermediate members (ages 11-13), and Senior members (ages 14-19). Medals will be awarded, using the Danish judging system. *Primary members can participate however they won't receive any certificate or pin.

Rules and Guidelines:

- 1) Topic should be 4-H related.
- 2) Foam boards (20 x 30 inches) are provided by 4-H Council, or you may purchase your own board, but the finished poster needs to still be the same size. Can be laminated. Contact your club leader.
- 3) Name, age, and club should be neatly printed on the back. If it is a project specific poster, put the number of years the member has been part of that project.
- 4) Photos, drawings, stickers, die cuts, and cardstock may be used created by hand or computer printed. **No** dimensional (3-D, pop-up) objects. **No** copyrighted characters (Spiderman, Sponge Bob, etc.).
- 5) Use of 4-H clover: You **must** use the specific 4-H clover and the "18 USC 707" must legibly appear either to the right of the base of the stem or below the lower right leaf of the clover. For more info and colors that are allowed, go to http://4h.ucanr.edu/Resources/Branding Toolkit/ on the State website. **No** image can be placed or screened over it.
- 6) No team/group entries, and only one poster/entry per member please.

***Blank posters can be picked up at Cheryl Wenzlik's house at 1210 Sequoia Ct on her front porch, at January council meeting or you can get your own poster at the Dollar Store. Poster sizes must abide by the above specifications. ***Posters must be turned in on or before Thursday, March 2th at Cheryl Wenzlik's house at 1210 Sequoia Ct or 4-H office Thursday hours: 8:30-11:30am – 1:30-5:30pm.

The posters will be displayed this year at the pancake breakfast. They will be judged and you will get a pin for your hat and a certificate for your record book. It is recommended to display them at the fair in the fall or present them at a club meeting.

Poster Scorecard:

Effective Title – explains what the poster is about	5 points
Suitable Subject – timely and age appropriate	5 points
Attracts Interest – gets viewers to look	10 points
Holds Interest – gets viewers to study	5 points
Conveys Message – accomplishes purpose	10 points
Depth of Message – evidence of learning	10 points
General Appearance – simple, balance, orderly	5 points
Workmanship – neat and well-constructed	5 points


