#### **Unfinished Business:**

- Fun night Reports—suggestions and ideas that make your area better or different
  - Fundraising-
  - Publicity- banner cost \$600 (\$150 to hang above Main street 1 week) add to budget. Have date on it, vinyl is easy to replace dates
    - Suggestion for 10 small vinyl signs (one for each club?) to hang around in communities to advertise Fun Night. Jessica F to look into price for the signs with the same company that is doing the large banner
  - Logistics-need to add game booths to logistics (maybe two clubs work together on this if needed.
    - Walkie talkies given to the club leaders during fun night in case

- clubs/booths need help or need bodies to run booths/give breaks
- Give access codes to all the clubs so they can get into buildings and set up.
- Cleaning supplies, push brooms and dust pans.
- Find out where dumpsters are for us to take trash out.
- Lights? Better communication with fair office on location of needed items/power, what not.
- Have 4-H office supply box and a Sick Kit
- Game Booths—variety of games were amazing and fun this year.
  - More games would be we need more room. Space is tight with what we have now.
  - Look into Tyler Jelly building.
    - Will it cost a lot more to have that building vs the auditorium
  - Anne J to redo the diagram that was done many years ago by Cindy D.
  - Quiet Dinner in cafeteria if the games are in the Tyler Jelly
  - Dance?
- Dining Food—2 clubs work together on food (?)
  - Bring everything you need to serve, clean
  - Come in early and plug in refrigerators if they will be needed
- Dining collecting tickets worked the way they did it
  - Need posters for price and menu
- O Prize Booth-need more room
  - Need more prizes but less choices..kids took a long time to decide
  - Fish tanks were a big hit, they "sold out" of those
- o Entertainment- Karaoke was a hit
  - Maybe set up somewhere different?
  - Sign to let people know that no ticket required
  - Maybe use the Fair sound system that is already in the building
- Silent Auction- good selection
  - Need to send out email with labeling requirements to clubs prior to event.
- Tickets- Only one Board of Supervisors Matt Hansen, attended and worked Ticket Booth. Invites were sent to all of them. Josh D. really enjoyed working the booth.
   Connection between the county and the cooperative is key.
  - Maybe have the Ambassadors/Blast extend the invite to Supervisors at the proclamation.
  - Need more play tickets for next year. Buy 20,000.
  - Motion by Sam L to add \$20 to the ticket budget for game tickets (2023) Vicky W with the second.
- o Other
  - 10% of presale tickets go back to clubs
    - An incentive for clubs to presale tickets, families to buy.
    - No longer have a budget issue
    - Brandy H with the motion to have 10% presale tickets to go back to clubs, Cindy D with the second.
  - Chili Cook-off for dinner-
    - Get a sample and then go back and pick your favorite for dinner.
    - Have clubs that want to enter to pre-enter so we know how much each club has to make (?)

- Livestock Judging Day Report
  - o 184 kids, 9 adults
  - The livestock judge was amazing
  - No pigs due to an issue but pig kids will receive credit for attending this event., meat cuts class covers all market kids.
  - Question was asked about pre-registration and Vicky said she doesn't think it is needed.
  - Question asked about if it is a good thing to have YQCA on the same day, yes! It
    gives kids the opportunity to get a requirement (two actually) out of the way and
    something to do during the down time while tabulations are being taken care of.
- Livestock Show
  - o Entries in...extension allowed 10 more in
  - o 85 kids
  - o 121 heads
  - Largest group is sheep with 52 animals,
  - Dairy goats and dairy cattle will be shown in jr ring.
  - Order...dairy goats, dairy cows, beef cattle, sheep, swine, meat goats.
  - Staggered start times, staggered times at scales
  - Snack bar will be simple
  - Still looking for a few judges
- Furs and Feathers

  - Need Livestock show to leave tables and chairs and panels
