Livestock classes consist of 4 animals which make 3 pairs, a top pair, middle pair and bottom pair. In each pair there are **3 basic sections**: Criticism, comparison and grant.

- Comparison: describe why 1 animal is better than the other
- <u>Grant:</u> explaining the opposite side of the pair... why someone would have switched these animals.
- <u>Criticism</u>: Give a specific reason why you still prefer 1 animal over the other

Transitions are used between pairs.

Use **tying thoughts or phrases** to make your presentation more interesting to listen to and not like it is a list of terms... paint an interesting and accurate picture.
