Evacuation Bag Checklist

Prepare an evacuation bag for every person before a wildfire and keep it easily accessible.

Plan to be away from your home for an extended period of time and make bags light enough to be able to lift into your vehicle.

What to Wear During an Evacuation?			
	Dress in natural-fibered clothes (cotton or wool) that will protect you from heat, embers, and flamers. Keep these items near your evacuation bag so they are readily available.		
	Cotton hat	Long-sleeved shirt that covers neck	
	Glasses or full coverage goggles	N95 mask or other face covering (e.g., bandanna)	
	Heavy shoes or boots	Cotton or wool socks	
	Leather work gloves		
	Long pants with sturdy belt
