Enrollment for the new year will begin mid-August. More information regarding enrollment will be available in the August Guidelines.


## A New 4-H Enrollment System is on its Way! 4-H Online to ZSuite


This is a reminder that family login level access to the 4-H Online system will be turned off on **June 23rd at 12 PM**. It is anticipated that family login level access will be granted in the new enrollment system **August 15<sup>th</sup>**.

Families and volunteers will not have access to either system from June 23- August 15, 2023. 4-H families are encouraged to delay re-enrollment for the 2023-2024 program year until the new system is open. You can complete the online self-enrollment process when ZSuite opens for enrollment after August 15, 2023.

If enrollment or re-enrollment is necessary during the interim period the systems are offline, the 4-H Office (559- 241-7519) will work with you to complete a paper enrollment process.

*Please note: All dates listed are subject to change based on the ZSuite vendor and UC ANR and 4-H needs. Any changes will be broadly communicated by the State 4-H Office. Any enrollments entered into ZSuite before the official opening will be deleted.*





## 4-H Sheep & Goat Show

### Saturday, July 29, 2023



**Fresno Fair Grounds**

Entries due: July 21st

Weigh-in & Preparation: 8:00 AM

Sheep Show begins at 9:00 AM & Goat Show begins at 9:30 AM

**Entry fees:** \$4/animal– includes showmanship and market class. Entries are due by July 21st via on-line entry. Late entries will be charged a \$5 late fee per animal. All fees are payable the day of the show.

**Animal Eligibility:** All animals shown at the 4-H Sheep & Goat Show must also be entered in either Caruthers and/or Fresno Fairs. Each exhibitor may enter and show up to 2 animals per species. *Exception– members that are now old enough for a livestock project but do not qualify by age to show at the Fresno Fair.*

**Grooming:** This is a “Dry Show” meaning all animals must be washed and groomed before they arrive.

**Bring:** shovels, rakes, and pitchforks. All areas must be cleaned prior to leaving.

**New this year!** Sheep Show and Goat Show starting times are staggered to help accommodate members showing more than one species. If a participant finds that 2 classes overlap, for courtesy to the exhibitors already in the ring, the class will only be delayed 5 minutes.

**Reminder:** The use of generators is not permitted on the Fair Grounds.

# YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS– ARE YOU CERTIFIED?

*Required to participate in the BIG Fresno Fair & The Caruthers Fair*


All youth livestock program participants are required to obtain annual certification from the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program. This requirement is mandated by the California Department of Food & Agriculture (CDFA) and the Division of Fairs & Expositions (F&E). Certification can be obtained through online training or at an approved instructor led training. The YQCA certification is good for one year and only needs to be completed once annually regardless of the number of species shown. Those not certified through this youth education certification program on the issues of animal welfare, food safety and character education are not eligible to participate at any California fair. The Big Fresno Fair and the Caruthers Fair requires the YQCA certification to be completed at time of project entry as your certification number will be required as part of the online entry process.

**ONLINE VS. INSTRUCTOR LED YQCA TRAINING** For both online and instructor-led training, you are required to register in advance on the <https://yqcaprogram.org/> website. Online training costs \$12 per exhibitor and may be completed at any time prior to entry deadline.




## YQCA In Person Training at Livestock Achievement Day April 20th ~ Follow Up Instructions

All participants will need to complete a pre- and post- survey online in order to access their certificates. The surveys are found on the "Enrolled ILT Trainings" page from the blue dropdown menu as seen below. Once the surveys are complete, certificates may be downloaded from the "Course Certificates" section in the blue dropdown menu. The **food** was delicious, the **weather** was perfect and the **Alli V Venue** was great!


**Set-up and Clean-Up** included lots of able bodied help!




## **Organization Overview of the 4-H Record Book**

A California 4-H Record Book contains the following items:

### **Section 1: Preliminary Information**

- \* Title Page
- \* Table of Contents

### **Section 2: Personal Development Record/ Sparks Achievement Form**

- \* Complete one Personal Development Report (PDR) form each year or the Sparks Achievement Form.
- \* Already have a Platinum Star? New short version PDR is acceptable. See PDR section for more details.

### **Section 3: My 4-H Story**

#### **Section 4: Projects\*\***

- \* One Annual Project Report (APR) form for every project you have completed.
- \* One expression page for every project.

### **Section 5: Collection of 4-H Work**

#### **Section 6: Leadership Development Report (Intermediate & Senior Members only)**

- \* Complete one Leadership Development report (LDR) Part 1 (Pre) and Part 1 (Post) per year.
- \* Complete one Leadership Development Report (LDR) Part 2 (Pre) and 2 (Post) per leadership role, per year.

#### **Section 7: 4-H Resume (Senior Members only)**

- \* Senior members create a 4-H Resume that highlights their skills, leadership and civic engagement development throughout their 4-H career.

### ***A Note about previous year's records:***

All of your previous records can be inserted at the back of the current year's book, in reverse chronological order (that means by year and the year you started is in the back and you work forward to the current year in the front) or you can have a separate book for each year– the option is up to you. Some county competitions want to see all of your previous records– so be sure to find out what your county wants before you compete.

***Sending to State Competition?*** Only submit the current year's records– don't send any previous year's records. The last section will be Section 7: 4-H Resume, there shouldn't be anything behind that.

### ***Are you a Junior, Intermediate, or Senior Member?***

Ages 9 through 10 *Junior Member* : Ages 11 through 13 *Intermediate Member* : Ages 14 through 19 *Senior Member*

**\*\*You must complete at least one Annual Project Report (APR) form to receive a year stripe and pin.**
