Application Requirements

To apply for the UC Master Gardeners of Monterey and Santa Cruz Counties Training Class, you must:

- Reside in Santa Cruz, Monterey or San Benito County.
- Attend an information session, as listed on the mbmg.ucanr.edu website.
- Submit a class application and participate in a selection interview.
- Be willing and able to share your gardening knowledge with others.

Once accepted to the program, selected applicants must:

- Pay a one-time class materials fee of \$350.
- Pass a fingerprint background check.
- Attend the 15 weeks of classes with **no more than one absence**.
- Complete all class assignments and successfully pass a final exam.

To maintain Master Gardener status, volunteers must complete:

- 50 hours of volunteer work on approved educational programs during the first year as a Master Gardener.
- 25 hours of volunteer work each year thereafter.
- 12 hours of continuing education in horticulture each year.
