This year the Commission was pleased to receive proposals for many wonderful education programs and restoration projects. The Marin County Board of Supervisors reviewed and approved the following grant proposals for funding in FY 2023-2024. These grant recipients, a mix of Marin non-profit organizations, will use the awards for equipment and supplies that directly benefit habitat, wildlife and fish populations in Marin.

Marin Audubon Society

Marin Audubon Society (MAS) was established more than 50 years ago to protect the environment. Marin Audubon's educational activities focus on birds and other wildlife, as well as wildlife habitat.

Shark Stewards

Founded in 2006, the Shark Stewards host community field events and ambassador



Chileno Valley Newt Brigade

Established in 2019, the brigade saves hundreds of newts as they cross Chileno Valley Road to Laguna Lake for breeding and egg laying during the seasonal rains. The grant is for purchasing safety equipment for the trained volunteers. Information:

International Bird Rescue (IBR)

Founded in 1971 in response to massive oil spills, IBR services all injured birds. They rescue and rehabilitate all bird species in Northern California. The funding is for clinical and medical supplies. Information: (707) 704-0350.

Environmental Action Committee of West Marin (EAC)


Golden State Salmon Association (GSSA)

Since 2010, GSSA has worked to restore California's salmon population through habitat restoration and education. The grant funding is to design and install interpretive signage, and to provide opportunites for underserved youth to attend and witness a hatchery rasied salmon release in San Francisco Bay. Richardson Bay Audubon Center and Sanctuary

The Bay Audubon Center and Sanctuary protects open space in Tiburon along the San Francisco Bay and provides nature education programs about local flora and fauna.
