




Los Angeles County 4-H Record Book Information

The 4-H program has a long history of record keeping. The focus reflects the importance of this life skill in our daily lives. Completing a 4-H Record Book is a process where you record project and club work using a standard format. The 2020-21 Record Books for Los Angeles County Competition are due to the Los Angeles or Antelope Valley (Lancaster) 4-H Office by September 6, by 4 PM or to an Incentives and Recognition Committee Member by September 7, by 9 PM. Los Angeles County 4-H Officer Book Information

Did you do a great job as a club officer last year? If so, be sure to submit a [2021-2022 Officer Book for the Officer Book Recognition Program](#). The forms and information are on the Los Angeles County [4H website](#). Officer Books are evaluated using the Danish system, and all officers have a chance to earn a Gold Medal for their officer work. 2021-2022 Officer books are due September 6, by 4 PM or to an Incentives and Recognition Committee Member by September 7, by 9 PM. Junior/Teen Leader Merit Award

Did you do a great job as a Junior or Teen Leader last year? Why not try for a Junior/Teen Leader Merit Award? At the time of the LA County Record Book evaluation, Junior and Teen Leaders may request that their 4-H records be reviewed for consideration for a Junior/Teen Leader Merit Award. To be eligible for this award, your 2021-22 4-H records must include:

1. A completed Leadership Development Report (LDR) for being a Junior or Teen Leader in a specific project
 2. A completed Annual Project Report (APR) for a Leadership Project that was attended.
- Signatures requested on the forms are mandatory for award consideration. A member may earn this award only once as a Junior Leader (ages 11, 12, 13) and only once as a Teen Leader (ages 14 and above).



The True Leaders: Culture, Power and Justice curriculum was designed to engage youth in critical dialogue and collective action in order to contribute to a more empathetic and just society. Youth have an incredible opportunity to see the world as bigger than themselves. This curriculum offers dynamic opportunities for youth to explore their identities, different cultures, new perspectives, and the histories that have shaped power and privilege within our communities. Youth will engage with peers, adult support systems, and communities to increase the resources and tools they need to advocate for positive community change.



Los Angeles County 4-H Emerald Star Program

The Emerald Star is an award given to a 4H member for planning and implementing an advanced leadership activity. Emerald Star is separate from any star rank. Emerald Star is not a 4-H rank. It has been designed to encourage members to plan and execute a goal outside the member's Community Club. The Emerald Star is for experienced 4-H members who have been in 4-H for at least two years and are at least 13 years old, as of Dec. 31st of the current program year. Each Emerald Star application will be evaluated for its value to the LA County 4-H Program, value to the community, practicality and feasibility.



Diamond Clover Awards - The California Diamond Clover is the highest achievement for which a 4-H youth member and young adult volunteers are recognized. All youth members and young adult volunteer who achieve the requirements are eligible to receive this award.



Awardees receive the California Diamond Clover Pin or Necklace Charm, a certificate and a recognition letter from the 4-H Statewide Director.

Applications are accepted year-round. Applications are reviewed by the 4-H Incentives and Recognition Advisory Committee and awarded quarterly.
