


Overview and Mission Statement

- Unreliable, miss deadlines
- Lack of recognition for contributions
- Arrogant, sarcastic, abrasive




Reach out to us when you experience:

Conflict Competence for Staff

Conflict Competence: Constructive Feedback for Positive Change

Learn to craft effective feedback, identify feedback triggers, and receive feedback skillfully

Conflict Competence: Getting to the Root of Group Conflict

Learn to apply the Goals, Roles, Processes, and Interpersonal Relationships team development model to group conflict and identify sources of group conflict

Conflict Competence: From Bystander to Upstander






Alameda County Master Gardeners

- Donated plants
















