MINUTES

Ripley Springstead, of the Clover 4-H and Advisory Team, led the flag salute and the 4-H pledge. Attendees were invited to add items to the agenda. There were no additions. Ripley Springstead shared why she wanted to be on the Advisory Team, followed by Mayra Fairbanks of the Stoney Creek 4-H Club.

The opportunity to discuss the purchase of archery supplies was presented. Christine Kampmann, Glenn County 4-H Community Education Specialist, explained that having the supplies would make holding the project indoors easier to achieve. The fairgrounds requires set up and take down at the time of each meeting and unfortunately, moving hay will require a lot of work and time from our volunteers. The cost of the supplies would be more than \$3500 not including shipping and handling. We also will need to purchase heavy duty shelving to store it when not in use. Colleen Cecil, of the Plaza 4-H Club, inquired about how long the items would last and she was informed that it should last several years depending on the use and that items could be replaced without having to replace everything.

Event committee updates were provided. Christine Kampmann relayed that Country Pumpkins was very pleased with the turn out this year and felt the 4-H'ers represented themselves and the program very well. Corie Hurlburt, from Willows 4-H Club, provided an update for the Bowl-A-Thon Committee, and asked for clubs to donate prizes \$5-\$10 value. Corie Hurlburt also gave an update for the Fundraiser Dinner Committee, and mentioned that tickets will be available at January Club Meetings and that each club would receive a \$1.00 back from every ticket sold. Christine Kampmann added that there will also be a bake sale and the Battle of the Bakers baking competition again. A save the date reminder was mentioned for the ABA Extravaganza on Saturday, January 13, 2024, and Presentation Day 101 taking place on Wednesday, December 6, 2023.

Mayra Fairbanks, Advisory Team Member, was asked to share about the 2023 Workshop Series for 4-H Project Leaders hosted by CA 4-H. Mayra said the zoom meetings were engaging, interactive and very helpful. Mayra also enjoyed being able to network with other 4-H leaders across the state and hear what they are doing and how they handle certain interactions. Also, Mayra said she has been sharing the information she has learned with other leaders in her club. Leaders were reminded that they will need to complete their trainings in order to receive their project lists and before they can hold a meeting. Christine Kampmann spoke about the Project Leader Workshop that was held, and the available resources at the UCCE Office. Participants were asked if their club formed a Coats-for-Kids Committee and Colleen Cecil, from Plaza 4-H Club said she would monitor the Plaza Elementary School location. Christine Kampmann introduced the 2024 California 4-H Camping Conference, and informed participants if they were interested in attending to please let her or the UCCE Office know. The Advisory Team will look into the leadership funds to see if we can help with the fees. Both Emiko Fairbanks, Stoney Creek 4-H Club youth member, and Ripley Springstead, Clover 4-H Club youth member, were interested.

For Good of the Order, Mayra Fairbanks, of Stoney Creek 4-H Club, shared that they did a canned food drive for Halloween and will be doing one again to benefit the Orland Food Pantry. Colleen Cecil, of Plaza 4-H Club, said they will be doing a drive thru for their December club meeting at the Glenn Success Center in Orland. During this time, members drop off items to be donated to the local pet shelter and non-perishable food for the Orland Pantry. Corie Hurlburt asked about the 4-H Scholarship checks being issued and was told the beginning of December. Colleen Cecil inquired as to when the Crab Feed sign ups would be available as well. Glenn County Farm Bureau Crab Feed sign ups will be available in the next few days.
