 - Enrollment As some of you may be aware, the SVF and the San Benito fair have asked for Livestock leader reports. If your club still has volunteers who have not completed all steps and they wanted to be a project leader, they can no longer move forward.

- For new families or new members, be sure to contact us as soon as you have a new family join so we can process paperwork and get them approved.
- Attendance now thru March is the time to review attendance both in the club meetings and project meetings.
 - Now is the time to find out and help resolve these attendance matters before it is too late. It's possible your club has a project that has not had a meeting. or members not showing up. Especially for fairs. I appreciate those who have been reaching out to me asking for guidance.
- Livestock leaders- April 1st is the typical date we ask all livestock members to be current in project meeting attendance before signing up for SVF. This reduces drama, misunderstanding or unfulfilled promises.
- Mid-year reviews proud of the volunteers who continue to make sure Monterey County 4-H clubs are following the requirements of building youth teams.
- o Sparks award I will offer a check in on the Sparks Award via zoom.
- Presentation event The online registration is up. as a Club Leader you will
 receive a list of any youth in your club who is presenting, and you will need to
 confirm their category.
- Sectional Presentation days: Just a reminder, the registration that goes into a sectional presentation day is not managed by the county office. Please follow all instructions that your club or members receive when they do sign up.
- o The results from **Fantastic Field** Day were handed out or mailed.
- Club surveys usually these are made by your club officers and go to the membership in March. It can be for members or for adults as well. Officers go thru these surveys looking for reasonable ideas. They then draft the new budget in pencil with those ideas.
- Also, as the club is looking for new officers, these ideas should be in the forefront because these new officers will be implementing them.
- Scholarships Please dust off your club scholarships for seniors, for Camp or state leadership conference to open no later than March and close by May. senior scholarships should be available to potential members at the meeting, by email. The instructions a due date of late May or early June. Your club should anticipate paying out the scholarship by June 30th if not sooner, so it clears the bank account this program year.
 - The names of the seniors should already be in your club's budget so you can remember who may apply. I will not need to do a review of everyone's scholarships this year because we did that last year at this time.
- Instead, I will doing a review of livestock rules or contracts. Its time to check in and see if your clubs are up to date with language and expectations. Especially before fair time. I will send out an email to review.
- I just attended a training conference at Davis for a review of what Thrive or
 Thriving means in the overall program. I know many of you volunteers already

understand and adopt this concept and I'm looking forward to creative ways to help introduce the concepts of youth thriving to those of you who are newer.
