

Each summer 4-H members aged 9 years old and up to having just completed 8th grade are eligible to attend Fresno County overnight 4-H Camp at beautiful Camp Keola on Huntington Lake. The camp session this year runs from-

The Keola camp staff provide delicious meals as well as lifeguards for the waterfront.

Our own high school age 4-H members act as Junior Counselors and plan camp activities as well as act as cabin counselors. Adult 4-H leaders volunteer to chaperone at camp. Another 4-H volunteer acts as camp nurse.

Camp Keola provides a full range of camp fun. The waterfront allows for swimming, kayaking, canoeing, paddle boating, as well as fishing. 4-H Fair Horse Show

Saturday, May 4th at "Verdi View Farm" at 1683 N. Del Rey Ave, Sanger, South of McKinley. Registration begins at 8:30 AM, Show at 9:00 AM.

4-H Fair Showmanship

All horses shown in hand with halter (Western) or bridle (English). This will be judged on the Danish system. Blue is Excellent, Red is Very Good, and White is Good. There are 3 divisions: 1st Year, Juniors (9-13), and Seniors (14 +). Medals awarded to top performers in each class. Champion and Reserve rosettes awarded to highest placings. Red and White awards compete for Maiden Champion and Reserve Champion rosettes.

Immediately following 4-H Fair, Trail Trials will begin on a cross country course and a trail pattern class. If time allows we will hold two Ride A Buck classes at the end of the show. Bring your dollar bills, winner takes all. Entry fee of \$25.00 per horse and rider covers entire day of classes. And includes the \$10 haul-in fee.




