

Ron Knight Sheep Award Winner Derek Rulon, Bowman 4-H






Derek Rulon has been a member of Bowman 4h for 10 years. He started as a 5 year old raising and showing his 2 pygmy goats. When he was 9 years old he started in the sheep project raising both a market lamb and a breeding ewe. This was the start of Derek's own flock. Derek's family has been raising sheep since his Mom, Crystal, was in Bowman 4H over 30 years ago. Over the years he has grown his flock to consist of about 12 ewes and one ram. Each year Derek cycles his ewes and helps with his family's ewes to make sure they breed for the Tehama District Fair in May. Derek has always enjoyed and taken pride in being able to take his own animals from his flock to the fair. Recently he made several purchases to continue to grow his registered Southdown flock. Derek has held many roles in his 4H from being on committees to being in different officer positions, this year he has held the office of club President. Outside of 4h Derek is involved in cross country, track and West Valley FFA. This year in FFA Derek made it to the State competition for Meat judging and impromptu speaking. Derek was also the Vice President of his FFA and he will be the 2024/25 President of his chapter. He was also chosen to be the FFA Superior Region Vice President for the 2024/2025 year.

This year Derek received the Ron Knight memorial award for his sheep breeding

project. This was the 3rd time he has received the award. This award is special to Derek and his mom because she was the first recipient of the award. Derek plans to continue to grow his flock to help other 4hers get

involved in 4h and the sheep industry.
