

forage variety trials, fertilizer evaluations, pests and noxious weed control. Highlights of his current weed control research include work on, perennial pepperweed, kochia, puncturevine, and common crupina. He is always available to visit with local growers, diagnosing issues in their fields, and talking management!

Her projects include juniper removal, riparian restoration, sagebrush and bitterbrush plantings, seedings, annual grass control, virtual fencing and collaborating with many partners. 
